LENT: Lent is a very special time for us. It is a time when Jesus asks us to come closer to him. He asks us to renew our lives and to grow in our relationship with him. The word relationship is important when talking about our lives. We have a relationship with Jesus begun in Baptism, a relationship which must grow and develop as we follow Jesus each day. In our relationship with Jesus we listen to him as he tells us of his love for us, and he listens to us in prayer. In our relationship with Jesus he works within us through the Holy Spirit and we work for him during our daily life. In this way we grow and develop in our relationship with him. During Lent we open our hearts and minds to him so can we can hear him loudly and clearly, and we can follow him more mindful of his love for us. We follow his example through Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. Through our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we become more conscious of his talking to us, and we become more conscious of out talking to him. For prayer fasting and almsgiving are three ways of listening, and three ways of praying. In prayer we talk, in fasting we become more aware of our weakness and in almsgiving we become more conscious of the poor. Therefore we become more conscious of Jesus. All of us have our own way of prayer, but all of us should spend some time in prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament each week. All of us have our own way of fasting, for our fasting is a means of overcoming weakness and sin in our lives.

We should choose a way of fasting which helps us overcome sin in our lives for when we fast Jesus is very close to us, and he can and does work in our lives changing us and making us better people. The is a difference between slimming and fasting so we should fast rather than use fasting to become more pleasing on the outside. Fasting is about inner change not about outer change. The change inside is a change of heart or a change that expresses itself outside, It is the change which Jesus calls repentance in the scriptures. This kind of change of heart can be done in many ways. It may mean giving up something or beginning something. The reading of the Gospel for the following Sundays Mass is always a good way of beginning something. Jesus fasted for forty days in the desert so our fasting should be desert experience of some kind. In other words fasting must hurt in some way. The third way of praying during Lent is the giving of alms. In this way we are listening to Jesus who says to us. I was hungry and you gave me to drink. I was thirsty and you gave me to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me etc. "Have mercy on me God in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offence. O wash more and more from my guilt, and cleanse me from my sin."
