Baptism and Involvement in Parish Life:

Bishop Larry is very anxious that more lay people become involved in their own parish. This is the mind of God in our time for the call comes from Jesus himself. We are called in Baptism. Let's not disappoint Jesus. Lets us carry out his call to us. I am delighted that some lay people are celebrating the Stations of the Cross on Monday Night, Rosary on Thursday Night, and the proclamation of the Word of God on Tuesday and Friday nights during this pandemic. They are showing us the way. I ask others to join with them during this pandemic, and I thank them. I ask new people to give their names to Geraldine. From a practical point of view we need to keep our parish alive, and active and living the Word of God. We have fewer priests but this doesn't mean that we have fewer parishes. It does mean that if lay people don't become more involved some parishes will die. And you will let it die. Nobody wants that result. In fact with the help of the lay people a parish can become more alive. The on line talks on during Lent are meant to get this point of view across. I hope you are finding them interesting. Our parish is filled with people well able to offer help, and encouragement in the parish. The faith of the parish will improve and develop with the involvement of lay people. Our young people will follow the example of adults if they are seen at Mass, and leading the parts of the Mass. I have heard some people say that we are now part of Enniskillen Parish but this is not true.

We are still our own parish and nothing has changed except the priests. Priests must now retire from administrative work at 75 yrs. But our lay people have not retired, but are still called to make our Parish better than the best. We are our own parish so let us not develop a defeatist attitude by saying we are part of Enniskillen. No, we are not. Surely our lay people can run, organise their own parish. Maybe laziness is the problem! We are called on to pray for vocations to the priesthood, and we are called to get involved in the parish. These two requests from God are one and the same thing. The faith of the people is what makes a parish. It is you the people who make a parish, and if you fail nobody else can do it. You are letting the parish die. Just to let everyone know that Pobal Parish still has its own Parish Account and is run financially from its own Parish Account.
